

Acton-Shapleigh Youth Conservation Corps

The ASYCC is turning 13!!! Since its establishment in 2001, the ASYCC has worked to protect the important water resources of Acton and Shapleigh. Each year the ASYCC employs local youth to help fight erosion and dedicated residents to inspect boats entering and leaving Mousam Lake and Square Pond.

The ASYCC is dedicated to providing environmental education, community outreach, courtesy boat inspections, technical assistance, and the installation of effective erosion control practices on private and public lands.

The ASYCC works to sustain and improve the water quality of Goose Pond, Loon Pond, Mousam Lake, and Square Pond collectively known as the Mousam Lake-Square Pond Watershed.

The ASYCC consists of two overarching programs: the Erosion Control Crew (ECC) and the Courtesy Boat Inspection Program (CBI).

ASYCC CBI Program

The CBI Program works to prevent invasive aquatic plants from entering the Mousam Lake-Square Pond Watershed by inspecting boats before and after they enter the water.



CBI ♦ Big Saves Plants and Water Chestnuts

In 2012, CBIs collected 263 plant fragments from boats entering Mousam Lake and Square Pond. CBI, Gail Boisvert prevented a highly invasive Water Chestnut from entering Mousam Lake. Water Chestnuts, like invasive plants, destroy a water-bodies' good health, preventing fishing and boating and are very expensive to remove or eradicate.

CBI • How you can help save our waters

Each CBI season, the ASYCC CBIs inspect thousands of boats entering Mousam Lake and Square Pond. Although the ASYCC CBIs do a great job, you can help ensure no "Hitchhikers" are on your boat. Two sets of eyes are better than one. Do your part. Before entering and after you leave a water body, inspect your boat, trailer, and truck to ensure no plant fragments have affixed themselves to your gear.

CBI Did you know...

- ♦ <u>Invasive Species</u> are plants, animals and microbes that are introduced from other parts of the world and have the capability to aggressively out-complete native species. With no natural predators, Invasive Species can take over areas within months after being introduced.
- ♦ <u>"Hitchhikers"</u> are invasive plants that affix themselves to your boat, trailer, truck, lines, etc., hitching a ride to their new homes. If not caught, they can infest waters of your favorite boating and fishing areas.



Preserve Maine Water Sticker Requirement

- ♦ How Much? Maine Residents Boat Stickers cost \$10 and is included with in-state registration. Non-residents stickers cost \$20.
- ♦ Where do I get a sticker? Town offices when a boat is registered. Non-Maine registered boat stickers are available wherever boats are registered or fishing licenses are sold. Stickers may be purchased on-line though the IF&W online store
- ♦ Where does the money go? 100% of funds collected go to the prevention and control of invasive plants and fish in Maine.







ASYCC Erosion Control Crew

ECC • Keeping Soil in its Place since 2001

The ECC works to fight erosion and shoreline loss, to increase vegetation and to educate landowners about the health of the Mousam Lake-Square Pond Watershed. The ECC is comprised of a group of local high school students who complete conservation projects around the Mousam Lake-Square Pond Watershed for eight weeks each summer.

The services of the ECC are open to property owners within the Mousam Lake-Square Pond Watershed. To work with the ECC, please contact the ASYCC to set up a FREE Technical Visit, which includes a site evaluation, and a FREE Technical Report. If the landowner chooses to work with the ECC to install the recommendations, the ECC will provide FREE labor.
